




Community energy is typically collaboration within local communities to ultimately own a renewable generation asset, with the profits generated returning back into the community



This year, a maximum of £3,750 is available for 4 groups for social impact projects



For every new customer that switches to Co-op's Community Power Tariff, £10 will be added to the Powering Communities Fund

Throughout the year community groups will apply for financial grants to help them start or improve their community energy project

Twice a year we distribute financial grants to the successful applicants

Strong youth volunteer network (Over 300 people)




Through the **Social Premium**, Patagonia provides additional financial support to Energy Garden above and beyond the procurement of renewable energy.

Key challenges facing Community Energy groups


